The European Ombudsman investigates complaints about maladministration in the institutions and bodies of the European Union. Any citizen of the Union or any natural or legal person residing or having its registered office in an EU Member State can lodge a complaint with the Ombudsman by mail, fax or e-mail. Complaints submitted by e-mail now constitute over 55% of the total number of complaints received by the Ombudsman.
