



## Ombudsman questions Commission decisions on reindeer imports

The European Ombudsman, **Jacob Söderman**, has recommended that the European Commission carry out a new on-the-spot inspection and consider reviewing two decisions (1) allowing the import of reindeer meat from Russia in light of its results. This follows his inquiry into alleged lack of impartiality in the administrative procedures leading to the decisions.

The decisions were made after an on-the-spot inspection carried out in Russia by the Commission's Food and Veterinary Office. They resulted in one EU-based company gaining approval to process Russian game meat for export to the EU.

The Ombudsman's inquiry revealed that the company and its Managing Director participated in the on-the-spot inspection by organising a luncheon, hotel and flight reservations, temporary fax facilities, interpretation services and inspection cars. This falls outside the normal practice of the Food and Veterinary Office to deal exclusively through the Commission's own delegation and the national authorities of the country concerned. The Commission has acknowledged this but confirmed that without the assistance of the company in organising the mission and facilitating its realisation, it would not have been possible for it to have taken place.

The Ombudsman considers that the company's participation in the on-the-spot inspection was inconsistent with the duty of the Commission and its staff to demonstrate their impartiality. This brings the decisions into question. He asks the Commission to respond to his recommendation by 31 March 2002.

The Ombudsman's inquiry follows a complaint he received from the Finnish Reindeer Herders' Association.
